Bayard Rustin

1912-1987



<u>Explore Bayard Rustin Center for Social</u> <u>Justice here</u>

Bayard Rustin was an LGBTQ and civil rights activist, known as a kev adviser to Martin Luther King Jr. He advocated for nonviolent resistance and organized the 1963 March on Washington. After being arrested for a "moral cause," he was publicly outed but embraced his sexuality openly. Choosing to work behind the scenes, he ensured his identity did not overshadow the movement. In 2013, he was posthumously awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom for his tireless work promoting equal rights.



What's Happening?!

How is everyone? The last two weeks have been overwhelming. With all the changes brought on by the new administration, our goal is to offer tools to help navigate through it all. Take your time with the information provided. Try not to get overwhelmed; review the material at your own pace. The information will remain accessible whenever you are ready to engage with it.

In the last week of January, we participated in virtual meetings with Equality IL, Advocates 4 Trans Equality (A4TE), and PFLAG National. A key takeaway was that executive orders are not the same as laws and cannot immediately change existing policies. However, one executive order did suspend the changing genders on passports.

The EO's will be challenged, with some lawsuits already underway. The chaos of late January was aimed to "shock and awe" - to instill fear & paralyze our actions in defending civil rights.
