Lesbian Visibility Week

Lesbian Visibility Week was first celebrated in July in 1990 in California. It arose out of frustration with the sense that gay men had a much higher profile and attracted more attention than lesbians. It was intended to raise awareness of lesbians in society.

Lesbian Visibility Day is celebrated on April 26th and is part of Lesbian Visibility Week and has grown into an international event. It started in Britain in 2008 as a way to celebrate a group of people who were likely to be marginalized. In 2019 it expanded from a single day to the full week celebrated now. Other countries also celebrate though different countries may celebrate on different dates.

An early supporter of Lesbian Visibility Week was Diva Magazine, a European publication. Linda Riley is the publisher of the magazine and was an early founder of Lesbian Visibility Week as well as a supporter of several LGBTQ+ organizations like GLAAD and the LGBTQ+ homeless organization, AKT.

Her goal with Lesbian Visibility Week was always to make it as inclusive as possible. In The Advocate in 2022 Ms. Riley said, "I had noticed that more and more, the L in LGBTQ+ was becoming particularly marginalized. I am a proud cis lesbian and a proud trans ally. But many in the LGBTQ+ community were beginning to equate cis lesbians with transphobes, which is fundamentally untrue. I wanted to help create a narrative that shows once and for all that the vast majority of cis lesbians are inclusive. We are intersectional. We want to remove any negative connotations associated with that word. So this is why during Lesbian Visibility Week we celebrate and center all lesbians, both cis and trans, while also showing solidarity with all LGBTQ+ women and nonbinary people."




