International Day Against Homophobia, Biphobia and Transphobia

Since 2004, May 17 has served as a crucial day for grassroots activists, organizations, institutions, families and friends of LGBTQIA+ individuals to come together. It aims to raise awareness about violence and discrimination faced by LGBTQIA+ people while advocating for change. This date marks the 1990 removal of homosexuality from the World Health Organization's Classification of Diseases.

We need to use our voices (and privilege) to educate on homophobia, biphobia, and transphobia, countering misinformation with facts and personal stories. By sharing the truth and listening, we can dismantle ignorance and fear. Engage in respectful dialogues, amplify marginalized voices, and challenge stereotypes. Education is key in breaking down prejudices, and every conversation can build empathy and understanding. We need you NOW!

Honoring Our LGBT Elders Day //



Honor Our LGBT Elders Day pays tribute to the lives and contributions of older LGBTQ+ individuals.

These trailblazers encountered considerable challenges, yet they remained resilient, paving the way for the rights and acceptance many enjoy today. Their tales of bravery and authenticity serve as an inspiration, reminding us of the progress made through their dedication.

Recognizing our LGBT elders highlights the significance of community and intergenerational bonds. It provides a chance to listen to their stories, learn from their journeys, and express appreciation for their sacrifices. This day encourages us to celebrate those who have paved the way toward equality and inclusion.

National Day of Awareness for Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women, Girls, and 2SLGBTQQIA+ Peoples

MMIWG2S is an acronym for Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women, Girls, and Two-Spirits. This movement recognizes that not only is this racialized violence, but gendered violence, mainly against feminized bodies, but also extending to men and Two-spirits whose genders do not conform to the colonial, binary gender system.

May 5th has become recognized as the National Day of Awareness for Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women, Girls, and 2SLGBTQQIA+ Peoples. Indigenous women, girls, and 2 spirits (as well as other LGBTQ+ indigenous people) in the United States and Canada experience a higher rate of violence than other groups. Among native women, 84 percent have experienced violence. In 2020 Savanna's Act became law to recognize this and address the responsibilities of various law enforcement agencies with regard to violence against indigenous women, girls, and 2 spirit people. Some ways to recognize MMIWG2S on May 5th include:

- Wear red
- Host a community event
- Contact elected representative to request that they draw attention to the issue and support legislation to combat violence against affected groups
- Share information about the issue

Guidance on Gender-Related Protections in Illinois

All individuals in Illinois have a right to be free from discrimination on the basis of their gender identity. As outlined in this non-regulatory guidance, issued March 2025, IDHR will enforce Illinois law that protects persons of all gender identities from discrimination, harassment, and retaliation.




